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Introduction of Mr. Pardoe & Ms. Adams: Librarians & Tech Integration teachers.

New library media curriculum incorporates tech research as a big component, esp. for 3rd-5th grades. The focus will be on using technology tools, research tied with the classroom curriculum by grade, and presentation skills. A presentation was given with samples of each grades' work incorporating technology.

There will be a Parents Meeting Series with the first meeting tentatively scheduled for 10/22 with a focus on Internet Safety, Databases, and Web 2.0 Tools that are available to both parents and students. This will be a "training" for parents who wish to learn more about technology and how various BCPS tools and sites can assist you and your student(s).
